### What is SJE 2?

SJE 2 continues an important discussion on societal questions related to how we are taught to communicate science and what communication teaches us about science. The objective of the summit is to explore: **What should next generation learning in science journalism studies encompass?**

The summit seeks to bring together Canada's University-level science journalism educators, science journalists, students interested in science journalism, journalism associations and others interested, to discuss the future of how science is communicated and next generation learning in the field.

### Call for Briefs

A key goal of SJE 2 is to hear and gather as many voices as possible!

We invite the submission of briefs that outline proposals, experiences, course outlines, class assignments, arguments, research results, reviews, or other important points, related to the summit objective. SJE 2's objective is meant to be interpreted broadly and we encourage creative engagement with the topic.

Length: submissions must be two written pages or less, including references and/or figures.

Alternative submissions of videos of under 3 minutes in length, 4-5 pictures/illustrations, or other\*\* are also possible. (\*Send us a note to pitch other types of submissions.)

### How to Submit (Three Categories)

Please include your name and affiliation at the top of the brief, as well as which category you are submitting to:

1. Students — What should your university classes cover?
2. Journalists and Practitioners — What does your knowledge and experience suggest for the future?
3. Educators — What do we know and how can we improve and innovate?
